Their teachings include 5 vows: <u>Ahimsa</u> (non-violence), <u>Satya</u> (truthfulness), <u>Asteya</u> (non-stealing), <u>Brahmacharya</u> (chastity), and <u>Aparigraha</u> (non-attachment).

## **Did You Know?**


Bahubali was the second son of the first Tirthankara, Rishabhanath. Although, not a Tirthanakara himself but he is worshipped by the Jains as an enlightened soul.

He is often seen standing in the 'Kayotsarga' (meditating) pose.

It is said that he performed such severe penance that he was surrounded by ant-hills and creepers wound round his legs and spread all over the body!
